Some of the benefits of earning an Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT) for transferring to CSU campuses are:

- Priority admission to the campus of your choice\*
- Guaranteed admission to a CSU campus\*
- Automatic CSU GE breadth/IGETC Certification
- You get a GPA index bump
- Facilitate the transfer process to a CSU campus where there is no articulation for major courses.

**Getting Prepared for CSU Campuses:**

- Complete 60 transferrable units by the end of Spring term prior to Fall admission that includes:
- The Golden four Courses with grade C or higher:
  - Written Communication
  - Oral Communication
  - Critical Thinking /Second year of English
  - A Transferrable Math Course
- Complete pre-requisite courses for your major (see Assist.org and plan the courses with a counselor)
- Complete General Education (GE) - Completion of all GE is not required for admission, but some programs and CSU campuses may require full completion of one of the following GE patterns:
  - CSU General Education Breadth
  - IGETC - for CSU campuses

**Note:** It is recommended not to complete GE for the high unit majors such as engineering unless it is required by the campus/program

- Earn Minimum GPA in Transferrable courses:
  - Minimum GPA of 2.0
  - Minimum of 2.4 for non-residents

**Note:** the GPA requirements depends on the average GPA of applicant

**Advice:**

- MEET with a counselor to plan your Transfer path
- Attend the Transfer Center Workshops
- Apply to California State Universities by the deadline - some programs and campuses also require supplemental application
- Follow up with the requirements and the instructions that CSU campuses provided you after you apply
- Apply on time for:

Fall term - October 1st –November 30th  
 Spring Term - August 1 - 31

The admission application deadline for International Students may be different. Check with the individual campuses.

**Impacted major** = where there are more applicants for a major at a campus than what the department can accommodate  
**Impacted campus** = where there are more applicants than what the campus is capable to accommodate  
**Elective courses** = any transferrable course beyond the major and GE requirements that are transferrable to CSU  
**Calstate.edu/apply**= website that includes CSU admission information and the online application form.
